Geri-connect is a service now provided at Goodwin Village for appointments with a Geriatrician (aged care specialist doctor). The appointments are online – meaning over the computer network. These visits provide valuable information to Dr. Oleg so as he can better manage chronic illness and disease processes of the aged person. Residents of the hostel as well as the village are able to have appointments via this medium. Any village residents who would like further information may contact Lynne for a discussion and / advice as to whether this service could assist them.
