The winter cold is still with us. Many of the lucky ones have had some escape to warmer holiday destinations. The others like me have rugged up and staying warm the best way we can.

Staffing is continually changing at Goodwin Village. This is due to many reasons such as lifestyle change, Visa rules, family commitments, change in role. This month we have seen the moving on in Registered Nurses Paula Noble and Steffy John and OT Ros George.

Due to the loss of these two registered nurses, we have needed to schedule increased hours in care planning roles for Cheryl Biggin, Cathy Potter and Liji Rejo.

We have then welcomed Melissa Bridgman to the Domestic staff, Chloe Livingston and Luke Slater to Personal Carer roles. Welcome aboard to these staff members.

The education staff have undertaken in this last 2 months has been assessing a change in residents' condition, clinical competencies, pressure injury prevention and consumer communication.

Allied Health have increased their visits recently with our newly appointed Dietician Caroline Wydro from Plena Health and Physiotherapist Anand Kumar who has his own physiotherapy business. The Geriatrician services have seen 8 clients via telehealth and the Optometry services 17 clients.

We were saddened by the passing of Joy Newell who has been a long time Village resident and friend. Joy resided in one of the units and then moved into residential care for the last year. Gus Edwards was also a regular respite visitor who passed away. Our condolences to both these families. BOARD NEWS

COVID-19

Thanks to everyone for complying with our ongoing protocols. Visitors testing each visit or every 72 hours if visiting more regularly. Face masks worn in residential care.

RESIDENTIAL CARE

The residential care facility is currently fully occupied but the respite bed is available and has plenty of availability in the coming months.

PHYSIOTHERPY SERVICES

Anand Kumar commenced providing Physiotherapy Services in the residential care facility at Goodwin Village in July 2023.

24 HOURS 7 DAYS A WEEK REGISTERED NURSING

The Government's mandated 24/7 Registered Nursing present in residential aged care facilities commenced on 1st July 2023. We will not comply with this requirement and are unlikely to in the foreseeable future. We have access to a Registered Nurse 24/7 with our 'on call' arrangement, that has been in place for over 15 years. We believe this more than adequately meets our residents care needs. Our number of beds is too high to be able to get a formal exemption from the requirement. If residents/families are concerned about our Registered Nursing presence and its impact on care, please contact the CEO of Goodwin Village to discuss the matter.

NEW ROAD IN RICHARDSON HEIGHTS

Mintern Civil is likely to commence the new road in Richardson Heights in August. The work on the kitchen service road is likely to commence after that, and both areas will be sealed at a similar time.

NURSING & CARE POSITIONS AVAILABLE

We are always looking for staff. Our focus is trying to appoint some more nurses. We would like to find some more Registered and Enrolled Nurses to take a team leadership role on the 'floor'. As a few of our care staff have indicated they are approaching retirement, we are also looking for personal carers.

The Village maintains a 'no obligation' waiting list for anyone interested in Units generally, or a particular Unit. The waiting list gives a person 'first offer' on the unit when it eventually becomes vacant.

The Village is always looking to build more new units to meet demand. If people are looking for a new retirement unit, they are welcome to make an inquiry.



- Investigation into incident is completed.
- Open disclosure is completed.
- Outcome of incident and recommendations are communicated to Board, staff, residents and their representatives.
